World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

Background

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD) is acknowledged every year on 15 June to highlight the impact of elder abuse on our community. Elder abuse occurs as a result of ageism and inequality in our society.

Elder abuse is any act which causes harm to an older person and is carried out by someone they know and trust such as a family member or friend. The abuse may be financial, psychological, physical, social, or sexual and can include mistreatment and neglect.

WEAAD was first officially recognised by the United Nations General Assembly in December 2011, following a request by the International Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse (INPEA), who first established the day of acknowledgement in June 2006.

Elder abuse is a global issue which affects the health, wellbeing, independence and human rights of millions of older people. It is an issue which deserves the attention of everyone in our community.

According to WHO, prevalence rates or estimates exist only in selected developed countries – ranging from 2 to 14 per cent. An Australian prevalence study is due for release later this year.

Individuals, communities, and organisations will come together across the globe to hold events and promotions on 15 June to raise awareness of elder abuse.

ELDER ABUSE PREVENTION NETWORKS

The Victorian Government has funded nine Elder Abuse Prevention Networks across Victoria to use a primary prevention approach to address elder abuse. Several of these networks have joined together this WEAAD to address financial elder abuse through the campaign *Inheritance: not an entitlement.*


